

How the update is applied:

- Compassy works based on **versioning**.
 - You can think of this as the equivalent of getting a new printed copy of a workbook - if you want to access the new material, you'll need to start a new workbook.
 - This means it is very clear which version users are working on or have completed
 - Most of the new content will only be available in the latest version (the exception being the latest reference material, which is available to all)
- Any module that has not been started will automatically be updated to the new version
- Anyone being newly added to the system or being assigned new modules will automatically get the new versions
- Completed modules are unaffected by the update process
- For modules that are in-progress:
 - The new version is an **optional** update, and nobody is forced to update to it. Unless a module has only recently been started and not much progress made, in most cases it will make more sense to carry on and complete the existing version rather than start the new one fresh
 - Updates to in-progress modules can only be applied by a supervisor, not the learner themselves, and are applied on a module-by-module basis
 - If a supervisor does choose to apply the new version update, this will archive the previous version and the learner will start the new version as blank. **This cannot be undone.**

Grandparenting

- Grandparenting has now been disabled with this version release.
- This was originally announced as available for the first year of the passport; in order to support any exceptional cases, almost an extra year of buffer has been provided beyond this.
- There is no exception or alternative route to be able to bypass this in the system, all modules will now need to be completed in full

Changes to the content

- Modules have been re-numbered to accommodate the two new Level 2a: Cycle 1 modules (for Solid Tumour and Haematology).
- Mock scripts have been renamed to make it clearer which levels they are written for. This has been applied across the system (so even if you are using an older version, it will show the new names).
- The structure of the Solid Tumour and Haematology modules has been changed slightly to improve allocation of the mock scripts.
 - The **required** mock scripts for your assigned level will now only show those scripts written for that specific level i.e., 2C allocation, you will only see 2C level prescriptions for **compulsory** completion.
 - The supervisor can also **optionally** assign as many of the **earlier** level scripts as required.
- Additional questions have been added to the pool of Core module MCQs, for both "SACT dose calculation" and "Background knowledge". The same number of questions will be asked, but the increased pool they are selected from will improve the variety

- Updates have been made to the funding route MCQs. The version names have also been removed from the funding route modules (the versioning is handled automatically by Compassly)
