

Joint BOPA, PASG and APTUK Position Statement

Safer Handling of Hazardous SACT Drugs: A Pharmacy Workforce Position Statement

The British Oncology Pharmacy Association (BOPA)*, the NHS Pharmaceutical Aseptic Services Group (PASG)⁺ and the Association of Pharmacy Technicians UK (APTUK)** are committed to supporting safe and effective practices in the preparation, handling, administration and waste disposal of Systemic Anti-Cancer Therapy (SACT) and cytotoxic medicines. Protecting both patients and the pharmacy workforce remains a central priority in the delivery of high-quality oncology care.

BOPA, PASG and APTUK recognises the importance of continued national dialogue regarding the safe handling of hazardous medicinal products across all stages of the medicine's pathway. There is clear consensus that staff exposure to these medicines must be minimised through safe systems of work, appropriate equipment, and robust governance arrangements.

Recent discussions within the wider healthcare community, including pharmacy and nursing colleagues, have highlighted the need for further exploration of how best to achieve this in practice. BOPA, PASG and APTUK acknowledge that existing evidence and practice vary across organisations and that further collaborative work is needed to develop clear, practical, and evidence-informed guidance for the UK.

Accordingly, BOPA, PASG and APTUK support a review of the preparation, handling, administration and waste disposal of SACT and cytotoxic drugs to:

- Clarify the current evidence base surrounding risks of occupational exposure and control measures including the use of closed system transfer devices (CSTDs) to mitigate those risks
- Understand the operational impact and feasibility of potential approaches; and
- Ensure any future recommendations for safe practice strike the right balance between safety, capacity, sustainability and cost-effectiveness.

BOPA, PASG and APTUK remain committed to working collaboratively with partner organisations, regulators, the wider multidisciplinary team and commercial companies to ensure that future guidance is proportionate, evidence-based, and safeguards both staff and patients from avoidable harm.
